ALCOHOL COMPLIANCE CHECK PROGRAM

The Delinquency Prevention Council along with the Watertown Police Department is pleased to announce the collaboration of Alcohol Compliance Checks. Alcohol compliance checks involve a person under the age of 21 entering an establishment where alcohol is either served or purchased and attempt to purchase alcoholic beverage while under the supervision of the Watertown Police Department. If the individual is served, the Watertown Police Department will either issue a warning or fine. With these efforts, we hope to decrease the sale to underage individuals. The program is providing FREE training to servers to properly identify IDs and other tools to be in compliance with the law. Three training dates have been set up for server training prior to the Alcohol Compliance Checks. The course is free of charge and open to any Liquor License or Bartender License holder in the City of Watertown. The training will take place at the Watertown High School on the following dates:

- ▶ Monday, October 19, 2009 from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm
- ▶ Wednesday, October 21, 2009 from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm
- ▶ Monday, October 26, 2009 from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm
