picking up litter and making each park cleaner for the community to enjoy. Please see the calendar for each location's day.

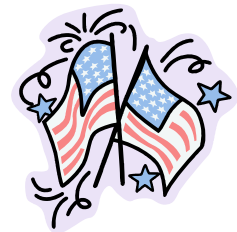
Fort Atkinson Park Clean up

Teen Court



In April 1998, the *Restorative Justice Program* expanded with the assistance of another federal grant to include a Teen Court. First time and minor repeat offenders may have their cases heard and be sentenced by a jury of their peers.

To participate in *Teen Court*, the offender must admit guilt. Parents must accompany the offender to the hearing and testify. Parents must also agree to enforce the Teen Court sentence as necessary. Juveniles must be sentenced to a minimum of five service to community hours, three

jury terms and an educational class, which includes a detention facility tour. If the juvenile successfully completes the sentence, the charge is dismissed and will not appear on his/her juvenile record.

A cost-benefit analysis of the teen court program was completed in 2005. The analysis revealed a net present value of \$75,400 to Jefferson County, and the authors recommended not only the continuation of the program, but its expansion.

YOU ARE NOT REQUIRED TO ATTEND TEEN COURT UNLESS YOU HAVE BEEN ORDERED BY HUMAN SERVICES OR HAVE VOLUNTEERED TO PARTICIPATE However, you may attend teen court for service to community hours!
